





"Sammy," a rainbow trout is helping the Montlake Laboratory of the Fish and Wildlife Service to invent an electronic fish counter.

We watched this revolutionary device in operation this week. "Sammy" swam back and forth through a plastic funnei while the almost-human machine clicked off a count for each passage through.

This is the first time such a counter has been developed in the United States, although a similar device is in the process of development in Scotland.
