# Duden Takes 'Safe' Route to N.W. Open Title

PORTLAND — Bob Duden took the safe route to the Northwest Open golf championship yesterday.

With a wide lead entering the final round yesterday afternoon, Duden played cautiously, hitting to the center of the greens and striving to avoid three-putting. "I don't care how many strokes I win by," Duden said, "just as long as I win."

"I knew that if I could shoot the back nine in 36 no one would catch me."

DUDEN SHOT the back nine in 35, one under par and

breezed to his third Northwest Open championship despite a late, brilliant rush by Seattle's Don Bies.

Duden, 47, finished with a 70 for 277, 11 under par, and three strokes in front of Bies.

Bies recovered from a disastrous double-bogey 5 on the second hole in the afternoon round to rip apart the back nine in 31, five under par. But Don had too much ground to make up, and Duden did not give him an opening by making a mistake.

In fact, Duden made very few misplays in the entire 72 holes. He reached 69 of 72 greens in regulation figures,

which is just about as well as anyone can play.

"I hit the ball well all week," Duden said. "But I still don't feel like I'm putting well."

"In the afternoon, I wasn't trying to do anything sensational. I was playing to the safe side of the pin, and didn't charge any putts. When Bies took that double bogey, I figured he couldn't win it unless I helped him. And I didn't want to do that."

BIES, WHO defeated Duden in a playoff for the 1962 championship, opened the third round yesterday morning six strokes behind

Duden. He shaved that deficit to four shots with a 70.

In the afternoon, Bies seemed ready to make an early charge. He birdied the first hole, but then all but shattered his hopes with the double bogey at the second hole.

There, Bies was just off the edge of the green, chipped about 10 feet short and three-putted.

"That was my only bad lapse of the tournament," Bies said. "For some reason, I couldn't seem to keep it going more than nine holes at a time."

From there, Al Mengert of Tacoma entered the chase, closing with a fine 68 for 282.

Mengert shared third place with Pat Fitzsimons, a 17-year-old Salem amateur who would have had a chance at the title except for one bad round, a 75 yesterday morning.

Mengert overtook Bies in the battle for second place until Bies rammed in five birdies on the final nine.

Don's rally, though late, thrilled a gallery of more than 2,000 who trudged around Columbia-Edgewater in 99-degree weather.

Bies chipped to about an inch at the 10th hole for a birdie, and followed with birdie putts of 15 and 6 feet at the 11th and 13th. He made a 12-footer at the 16th and chipped in from 25 feet at the 17th.

THE VICTORY was worth \$1,850 to Duden, who also won top pro money two weeks ago in the Lilac City open.

Bies will head for Akron next week for the American

Golf Classic. Duden and Mengert left last night for Boise to play in the Idaho Open, where Al will defend the title. Duden was runner-up there last year.
