# Renee gets to play in N.J. net meet

Scott, formerly one of the topranked men's players, said he was going by information in a gynecological exam and was not considering the chromosome factor in allowing Richards, a 41-year-old West

izes in eye surgery for children, to play in the August 21-29 event. United States Tennis Association officials yesterday said they will make a decision by August 20 eight days before the start of Forest Hills - on whether Richards can play in the United States Open. George Gowen, U.S.T.A. general counsel, said it was "very likely" they would require Richards to undergo a karotype test, which would show whether her chromosomes

were male (XY) or female (XX). Doctors say a sex-change operation does not change the chromosomes. W. E. Hester, U.S.T.A. vice president, said it would be "damn near impossible" for her to pass. "She applied and has been accepted," Scott said of her entry in the Tennis Week Open. "I accepted her on the basis of a gynecological affirmation that she is a woman. There is no rule in tennis that any tests must be used to determine

what a woman is. The phenotype

test is what I used, consisting of physical tests - hormone levels, breast development, facial hair, etc. I did not use the karotype a genotype test to check her choromosomes."

Scott stressed that personality was a big factor in her acceptance for the South Orange event. "He was a sensational guy, a sensitive, good sports person," Scott said. "I don't feel that has changed with the sex change. He was terrific und I assume she is terrific, too."

## Sounders' fans will see all in playoff

One way or another, Seattle fans will see all the action for as long as their Sounders stay alive in the North American Soccer League playoffs. The Sounders meet Vancouver in

a first-round playoff test next Wednesday night in the Kingdome. If they win that one, they go to Bloomington for a quarterfinal game against the Minnesota Kicks August 21. 
### Fought fights back, wins Open on 2nd extra hole




