## Martin-Jackson feud still raging

Compiled from news services The Reggle Jackson-Billy Martin struggle may not be over after

Martin's version of his resignation from the Yankees, and Jackson's reaction to those comments, sent shock waves through the team yesterday requiring a vote of confidence for both Jackson and Martin by George Steinbrenner, Yankees principal owner. "I think both men have grown up in the last year," Steinbrenner said after the Yankees' 8-7 victory over the Milwaukee Brewers in Yankee Stadium vaulted them

into second place, 7½ games behind Boston. "I have confidence Billy will be back in 1980. I hold Reggie in high esteem." Martin, in a gathering with reporters, singled out Jackson as the prime cause for his resignation, but insisted he has "no malice in

my heart" for the controversial \$3 million slugger. OVER THE spaghetti, ravioli and steak pizzaiola, Martin said that anger over Jackson's actions upon his return from a five-day suspension prompted him to re-

sign as manager of the Yankees and to utter his ill-advised "liar" comments about Jackson and Steinbrenner. At the same time, Martin again said he was sorry that he de-

scribed Steinbrenner as a "con-

victed liar" but he refused to back

down from his statement that

Jackson is a "born liar." "I'll have to ask my parents if I was born a liar," Jackson said wearily last night, "but other than that my comment is what I've been saying all year — I have no comment and I have nothing bad to say about anybody." However, the controversial slugger was summoned to Steinbrenner's office less than an hour

"He did the talking and I listened," Jackson said. "I respect

George Steinbrenner and that's all I'm gonna say. I know what I said and what I feel but what he told me he told me in confidence." Jackson, while not commenting directly on Martin's version, said it was "sickening" playing in New

STEINBRENNER was neither surprised nor offended by Jackson's comment. He said he thought Jackson meant it for the fans who have booed him since Martin's resignation in Kansas
