> chosen in the National Football League draft's fourth round, was activated yesterday by the Seattle Seahawks. Dion had spent a month rehabilitating his injured left kneecap. "I'm exhausted right now,"

> Dion said after his first workout with the team. "But I'm really happy." Dion was given the green light

by team doctors yesterday and will make the trip to San Francisco tomorrow, although he probably will not play Saturday against the 49ers.

Terry's new status has given him a fresh outlook. "There's a definite pecking order on a football team," he said "The scum of camp are the ones who are always in the training room. I'd like to move up a little."

Dion said it is time for him to begin "hitting someone." "I've got a lot of aggression, he said. "This is the time of year you rid yourself of all that. I haven't had a chance to get in any good hits. You like to earn the respect of your compatriots." After a steady diet of weightlifting, swimming and riding a sta-tionary bike, Terry was given approval five days ago to begin

nearly two weeks. "I'm really an unknown quantity, but I still feel I have a chance to contribute this year," he said.
"There are the unseen possibilities. I want to be ready for anything that presents itself. I'm not going to count this year off. I've never been a patient person. Persistency is what it's all about." Dion underwent surgery on the kneecap last January and had an arthroscopy in June for further correction. He played all last season at Oregon with severe pain, he said.

"Last year was pretty bad. I never want' to go through that again," he said. "It gets pretty sore by evening, but it's very bearable right now."

Dion said team doctors told him the kneecap "is as good as it'll get for quite a while. They said there will be some swelling and there may be some pain, but not nearly like it was in college. I'm pretty confident it'll hold up." Dion looks the part of a defensive lineman, big and tough at 6 feet 6 inches and 260 pounds.
