tastny, Goulet named to Hall of Fame

Former Quebec Nordiques teammates Peter Stastny and Michel Goulet were named yesterday as new inductees to the Hockey Hall of Fame. The Nordiques are gone from the NHL, becoming the Colorado Avalanche in 1995, but Goulet and Stastny

represent the Nordiques' heydey in the 1980s.
Stastny, 42, and Goulet, 38, will be officially inducted into the Hall of Fame on Nov. 16, along with Roy Conacher in the veterans category and Notre Dame College founder Pere Athol Murray as a builder.

The Vancouver Canucks suspended Pavel Bure without pay yesterday after the club's leading scorer made good on his threat not to show up to training camp. Bure, who led the Canucks with 51 goals last season, went public last month citing "personal reasons" that he wants to be traded and will never play in a Vancouver uniform again. The three-time 50-plus goal scorer has one year left on a contract that is reportedly expected to pay him about \$8 million.

The NHL named Toronto as the site for its 50th All-Star Game to be played Feb. 5-6, 2000. It will be the eighth All-Star Game in Toronto, but the first since 1968. The 1999 game is scheduled Jan. 24 at Tampa, Fla.

Discouraged Hostetler leaves Redskins

Discouraged 15-year veteran Jeff Hostetler cleared out his locker and apparently left the Washington Redskins after a morning meeting with coach Norv Turner over his demotion to third-string quarterback. Turner said he did not know when or if Hostetler would return. He would not discuss the details of their conservation, other than to say it concerned Hostetler's frustration over being relegated behind Trent Green and Gus Frerotte on the depth chart.

The Detroit Lions, off to an 0-2 start, yesterday named rookie Charlie Batch as their starting quarterback, with Scott Mitchell demoted to third string behind Frank Reich. Batch, 25, was the Lions' secondround draft pick out of Eastern Michigan.

Federal prosecutors looking into alleged corruption in the awarding of Louisiana riverboat casino licenses have evidently decided not to indict San Francisco 49ers owner Edward DeBartolo Jr. on racketeering charges, although he remains a target of the investigation, DeBartolo's lawyer said.

North Carolina wide receiver Jason Peace will miss the rest of the season after tearing his left anterior cruciate ligament at practice yesterday. Last year as a sophomore, Peace was third on the team with 32 catches for 418 yards and two TDs. BASKETBALL

Kings offer Adelman coaching job

Having signed Chris Webber and Jason Williams, two players with off-court problems, the Sacramento Kings offered their vacant coaching job to Rick Adelman, a coach with a track record of dealing with troubled stars.

Adelman, who twice coached the Portland Trail Blazers to the NBA Finals, is considering a multiyear offer that would make him the Kings' eighth coach since the team moved to Sacramento in 1985. The job has been vacant since Aug. 18, when the Kings fired Eddie **Jordan**, who left with a 33-64 career record. Adelman earned high marks for his ability to work

with problem players, such as Golden State's Latrell Sprewell and Portland's Rod Strickland. A player for the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks has been ordered to turn her 3-year-old daughter over to her ex-husband while court officials in Michigan decide if her basketball career interferes with her parenting. Pamela McGee, a mother of two and a starting forward for the Sparks, said the court is punishing her

because she plays basketball. Katie Smith scored 17 points as the United States' women's basketball team ended a five-game series with the Australian national team by winning 71-53 in Sydney. The Americans finished with two straight victories after losing the first three games.

ELSEWHERE China mulling 2008 Olympics bid

Five years after his country's bitter defeat to Sydney in the race for the 2000 Olympics, the president of the Chinese Olympic Committee has informed the IOC that

China is seriously considering a bid for 2008. A Chinese bid would have a major impact on the race for both the 2008 and 2012 Olympics. China would be a major challenger to Toronto, the 2008 front-runner. and that would be welcomed by the United States, which is planning a bid for 2012 with Seattle among the

American host candidates. If Toronto gets the 2008 Olympics, a U.S. city would have virtually no chance of winning the 2012 contest hecause the IOC would not return the games to North America four years later. Ed Kosiski was honored as the NASCAR

Winston Racing Series national champion yesterday, the first dirt-track driver in 11 years to win the title. The 33year-old driver from Omaha, Neb., will receive \$133,500 as the nation's best short-track racer. Golfer John Daly has told teammate Mark

O'Meara he will play for the U.S. Dunhill Cup team next month at St. Andrews in Scotland. After suffering a minor breakdown on the course during the Greater Vancouver Open three weeks ago, there had been rumors Daly, a recovering alcoholic, would withdraw from the U.S. team. But O'Meara, who is expecting to captain his three-man team that also includes Tiger Woods, said yesterday he is sure Daly will be back to compete at the scene of his 1995 British Open triumph.
