Maxwell turns himself in

Sonics guard Vernon Maxwell surrendered to police in Charlotte, N.C., yesterday, more than a week after a warrant was issued seeking his arrest for an assault complaint.

Maxwell was released from the Mecklenburg County Jail after posting a \$2,500 bond for a charge of assault on a female.

Maxwell, 34, was wanted after a Charlotte woman said she was punched and kicked several times in her home Sept. 2. Heidi Hayden suffered bruises and scratches and refused treatment, a police report said. Derek Fisher, a reserve guard for the Los Angeles Lakers, has an ankle injury that might sideline him for three months or longer.

The Portland Trail Blazers said they have signed free agent center Will Perdue to a two-year contract and re-signed free agent forward Stacey Augmon. Perdue, a 12-year NBA veteran, spent last year with Chicago, where he averaged 2.5 points, 3.9 rebounds and one assist in 67 games. Augmon has spent the past four seasons with the Blazers as a backup at guard and forward. He averaged 3.5 points and 1.9 rebounds.

The Miami Heat signed free agent center Todd Fuller and forward Don MacLean to contracts.

George Lynch, a Philadelphia 76ers starting forward, might not be ready for the start of training camp Oct. 3 because he is recovering from a broken left foot. Ian Gangelhoff, the woman who admitted helping Minnesota basketball players cheat on their schoolwork, will plead guilty to a charge of misappropriating funds, WCCO-TV reported. The former tutor has agreed to plead guilty and testify before a grand jury. In exchange, federal prosecutors will ask that she not receive any prison time. The federal investigation reportedly centers on former coach Clem Haskins.

Gastineau gets 18 months in jail

Former Jets star Mark Gastineau was sentenced to 18 months in jail for failing to complete an anger-management course after hitting his estranged wife. Gastineau admitted in May that he had violated terms of his probation after a guilty plea to misdemeanor assault in October 1998. He was ordered to spend a year in a treatment center but left after about four months, prosecutors said.

Gastineau's lawyer asked the judge to give the former defensive lineman another chance to straighten out his life. But Manhattan criminal court Judge A. Kirke Bartley told Gastineau, "I have given you beyond a second and third chance.

Tank Black, a former NFL agent, dropped an appeal of his decertification by the players union for recruiting violations, the union said. Black, 42, and six co-defendants are awaiting a Jan. 8 trial on criminal charges of conspiring to gain control of the salaries and signing bonuses of University of Florida football players that Black's sports management firm represented.

Playing on a line with twin brother Henrik at center, Daniel Sedin scored a goal and set up two others against his old Swedish club before a crowd of 11,296 that included NHL commissioner Gary Bettman. Playing in Europe for the first time, the Canucks will face the winner between two Stockholm teams,

Hill breaks hand; fight postponed

Virgil Hill broke his right hand during a weekend sparring session, forcing the postponement of his fight Saturday in Las Vegas against WBA cruiserweight champion Fabrice Tiozzo.

"Dr. Robert Voy examined Virgil Hill yesterday and found that he had injured his right hand and recommends to the Athletic Commission that he should not fight for four to six weeks," said commission executive director Marc Ratner.

Hill also has ligament damage in the hand and a muscle tear in his left biceps.

Redhawks extend SPU soccer skid
