






Eagle Crest Resort – Ridge Course

Format

There are two team competitions over the first 36 holes – best 2 net of the 4, and each professional will play a net four-ball with one amateur.

Handicaps at 80% will be used in the team games.

The championship is a 54-hole stroke play with professional and amateur purses.

After 36 holes, the field will be cut (to low 70 players and ties) and repaired by score.

Oregon's Fun Four-Person Team Tournament

Years back, when sheep mowed the fairways at Waverley CC, George Smith, a Scot from Oakland, CA won the Oregon Open's inaugural championship including a course record 74. Some of golf's most prestigious names followed in his footsteps, including Tommy Armour, Horton Smith, Chuck Congdon, Bob Duden, Bill Eggers, Jerry Mowlds, Pat Fitzsimons, Rick Acton, Peter Jacobsen, Jeff Coston, and Mike Davis. The tournament scoring record is held by Brian Nosler at 198, set in 2009 at Brasada Ranch.

The course was designed by John Thronson, who was heavily involved in many PNW designs, notably at Running Y and Brasada Ranch. Since the day it opened back in 1993, the Ridge Course has been regarded as one of the most well-rounded courses you'll ever play. It's a course that has terrific flow and one that you will never get tired of playing. Carved out of an ancient juniper forest with views of the Cascades, the "Ridge Course" offers ample room off the tee and generously sized greens.
