HANDICAPPING SECRETS

It's Study of Form and Condition Times Writer Explains Theories

There is no mystery surrounding handicapping. The form charts from which the handicapper gets his information on the past performance of each horse, on which to base his calculations of the probabilities of the horse, are accessible to everyone.

Today he introduces his subject and daily he describes one factor that enters into a handicapper's problems.

For this reason, of paramount importance in handicapping is an intimate knowledge of the individual horse. Herein enters the personal observation and judgment of the handicapper as to the condition of the horse, his disposition, condition, past behavior, his like or dislike for different kinds of soil, track conditions, the ability of the jockey and the trainer, and so forth.

It is this very complex that gives the subject its fascination and makes it so difficult to teach.

It is the purpose of this series of articles to touch upon some of the various factors that constitute handicapping—one at a time.

Apprentice Allowance

Is a five-pound concession in the weights, accorded to apprentice jockeys during their apprenticeship.

This apprenticeship officially ends exactly one year from the date an apprentice jockey rides his first start as a recognized rider. Then, he becomes a full-fledged jockey and is no longer entitled to the pound allowance.

Because the apprentice allowance is indicated by an asterisk preceding the weight listed on the official program, it is humorously referred to as a "bug". This apprentice allowance is known as "bug boys".

Under the Washington rules of racing, apprentice jockeys, bound by a written contract with the owner of their parents to win or trainer for a term of not less than three years, gets this pound allowance in all classes of racing.
